Toys form the Past



Y3 Learn all about Darlington

This term, year 3 have completed a local study about Darlington. Working closely with the Head of Steam museum, the children learnt all about Darlington's past and how the first passenger train helped put the town on the map. The children found out about George Stephenson (1781-1848) and Edward Pease (1767-1858), whilst also taking in the sights and sounds of the town. They visited the Head of Steam



museum as well and learnt about steam trains and the roles on board these magnificent trains. A story teller also visited us in school. She told us a great story about the birth of the railway and of a hungry station cat.







After a fantastic visit to The Trincomalee in Hartlepool, the children in 2D have immersed themselves in finding out about life at sea and famous explorers and pirates. They played dice and dominoes just like real pirates would. They obeyed Blackbeard's demands for curtains that were opaque in their science lesson

and they tested materials to see which made the best stuffing for a pirate soft toy. They have had a very busy term- ooh arrrgh!
