### Y5 Investigate the River Tees

Y5 had a fabulous day out investigating the River Tees as part of their topic on rivers. Their journey began at the Teesmouth Field Centre with a talk about the Tees. Did you know that it begins at Cross Fell and flows for 70 miles to its mouth at the North Sea? It has one of the best water falls in Britain, High Force.

Next, they visited the Transporter bridge in Middlesbrough. The iconic bridge was built at a cost of £6000 (£6,000,000 in today's money) and was opened in 1911. It

is one of only eight remaining in the world.

After that, the children travelled back to Hartlepool, where they constructed a model of the River Tees in the sand. A great day was had by all.
