

## Maths:

Develop a greater understanding of numbers to 100 and be able to use a knowledge of Place Value. The children will continue to work on addition and subtraction skills using 2 digit numbers. They will also use money to further their knowledge of numerical operations. Multiplication and division will be taught.

## Geography

Using maps children will locate the world's seven continents and five oceans. They will identify hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator and the North and South Poles.

## R.E

There are three questions that Year 2 will focus on in RE: How do Hindus worship? How and why is Diwali special for Hindus? How and why is light important at Christmas? The children will study both the Hindu and Christian religions.

## Science :

### Uses of everyday materials


Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for different uses  
Compare how things move on different surfaces.  
Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. A number of experiments will be carried out to encourage investigation skills.
