

Maths

Children will count forwards and backwards from any given number. They will count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words. Using equipment and mentally they will identify one more and less. Using objects and pictorial representations children will represent and compare numbers. They will explore number bonds and use this knowledge to help add, subtract and answer simple mathematical problems.

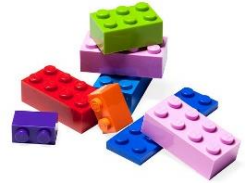


MFL

Children will be introduced to the language and culture of France. They will learn simple greeting and how to count in French.

English

Children will look at a range of texts (recount, stories, instructions and letter writing). They will listen to and discuss these texts and think about what words mean. Children will predict what is going to happen and discuss the significance of the title. They will learn how to form lower and upper case letters correctly. Children will orally compose a sentence before writing it with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. They will revisit graphemes learnt and be taught new ones. They will learn to read and write Year 1 common exception words.



PSHCE/SMSC/Rights Respecting

The children will begin the year by creating a class charter to set out ways they can ensure they are following the school code of conduct. They will also look at what it means to be and how they can be a 'good' person. Next they will look at how they have changed since they were a baby and how they have developed. Lastly they will look at how to make themselves and their local environment a better place.

History

The children will explore a range of toys that are from the past and present. They will compare toys that their grownups played with to toys they play with now. They will be encouraged to use language and phrases linked with time. Also they will order toys by how old they are.

The children will be learning how a church is important to Christians. They will look at what artefacts are in a church and what they are used for. They will also get the opportunity to visit a church to experience what happens there as well.

Topic/Theme:

DT

The children will be looking at which materials are best to make a toy box for a train. They will explore techniques and tools that will help make a solid structure.

Computing

Using Beebots the children will look at coding and algorithms. They will begin to understand what an algorithm is and begin to debug incorrect codes. They will also look at how to stay safe when using the internet.

Science
